Capturing a Year of Stories: The Release of The Chronicles

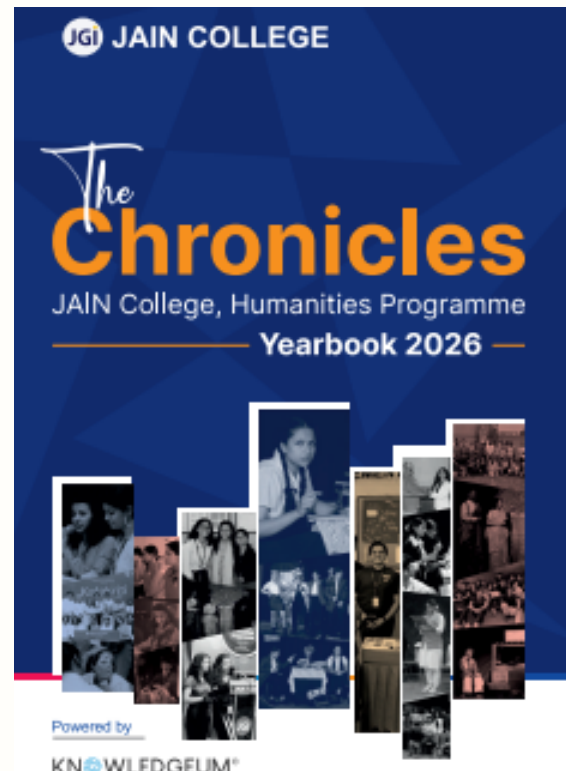
