Summer Workshops at Knowledgeum Academy



This summer, Knowledgeum Academy invites young learners to explore creativity and innovation through its Summer Workshop Series, designed as engaging, hands-on learning experiences that encourage skill development, collaboration, and exploration.

Running from 6 April to 17 April 2026, the programme features two specialised workshops. The Theatre Workshop, open to learners aged 8–16 years, introduces participants to storytelling, stage expression, and performance through interactive activities and group exercises.

The STEM & Robotics Workshop, for learners aged 7–16 years, focuses on problem-solving through technology and engineering concepts, allowing participants to experiment with robotics, simple programming, and collaborative design projects.

Each workshop is structured as a 10-day immersive programme, combining guided learning with practical activities. The workshops will conclude with a special showcase, where participants will present their work and demonstrate the skills developed during the programme.
